**Global Truck Driver Shortage** Report 2023

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### Global trucking industry revenue growth positive but steadily slowing down

The global trucking industry's real revenue growth nearly halved in 2022 versus the previous year (down to 6% versus 10.5% in 2021) and is expected to further slow in 2023 (reaching 4.2% growth versus 2022), along with economic and trade growth.

This trend reflects the impact of reduced demand for goods transport since Q4 2022, as inflation and tight monetary policies weighed on consumption and investment.

Additionally, the industry's cost base increased significantly in 2022 and 2023.

The trucking industry's y-o-y real revenue growth is expected to further fall to 3% in 2024.





How much difficulty truck companies are having to fill driver



% of unfilled truck driver positions in 2023 | Number of truck driver jobs unfilled in 2023<sup>1</sup>


